**Minutes of Ordinary General Meeting held at The Royal British Legion, Rodney Street,  
Edinburgh EH7 4EL at 1300hrs on Sunday 15 May 2016.**

3. **Chairmans Welcome;** Mick Walker welcomed everyone and thanked them for attending.
4. **Welfare;** Mick Walker, happily, has recovered from his heart attack and is now on the mend.
5. **Minutes of Previous Meeting;** The minutes of the last meeting were passed as being accurate by Gordon McLeod and seconded by Brian Earl.
6. **Matters Arising;** There were no matters arising
7. **Secretary's Report;**
  - (a) **Renaming of Kingsbury Barracks—12th April 2016;** Branch members attended the renaming ceremony at Kingsbury Barracks. The barracks were renamed “Lonergan Lines” in memory of SSM John Lonergan who was tragically killed in action whilst attending camp at Al Milah, Aden in 1965. There was good representation from other Airborne Engineer Association branches as well as 131 Commando Squadron Royal Engineers. Major (Retd) Robin Ward led the tributes to John Lonergan and John Donaldson also gave a very good speech about the camp at Al Milah. This was a fitting tribute to a good man and soldier. Major Robin Ward also presented a trophy to Major Jim Foster OC 131 Commando Squadron Royal Engineers on behalf of 300 Squadron. We thank Robin for his kind contribution. Frank Murray has informed us that he had received correspondence from Johns family, now residing in Canada, stating how pleased they were that John could be remembered in this manner after 51 years. There was tribute to John Lonergan in the family's local newspaper in Canada.  
In 131 Commando Squadron Royal Engineers newsletter there is a film regarding “Parachute Engineers” and 131 Parachute Engineer Regiment is very well represented.

- (b) 300 Squadron Flag;** We were very fortunate to be handed back 300 Squadron Flag that had been held by Jack Braithwaite. We will be looking at ways of restoring the flag. - (b) **Aden 1965 GSM ;** John Donaldson received a letter, in reply to his, from RE RHQ Chatham informing him there was nothing they could do in securing the award of the GSM for service in Aden in 1965. They also intimated that there was no record of John applying for the GSM for service in Aden in 1965. They sent John a form to apply for the G.S.M which he duly completed and submitted. Their answer was to send him another Veterans Badge—he does not know why.

Kirsty Oswald, who is an MP for Renfrewshire, was debating on a National Defence Medal at Westminster Hall on 12 April 2016. She raised the point about the awarding of the G.S.M to members of 131 Para Engr Regt. who were in action at Al Milah, Aden in 1965. Needless to say The Government Minister waffled his way out of the situation, quoting a speech made by Sir Winston Churchill in 1944 on medallic recognition. At the moment everything is still with Kirsty Oswald who at least is trying to get something done. There will be other debates on a National Defence Medal hopefully in the near future.
